ASB is still low from what it has previously been. I have been in the area and engaged with the young people, no concerns or incidents involving large groups.

People trying car doors is a problem at the moment within the Briercliffe area, a number of vehicles are being left insecure then the offender(s) are taking items of value. CCTV is still being sought in the area and a Lancashire talking message has been sent out. Two people have been arrested and enquiries ongoing.

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Borough Councillors' Report September 2021

- Firstly, a big thank you to the organisers of the Gala. Another well organised brilliant and well attended community event.
- After numerous requests, the Police are doing regular speed tests.
- GP Practice assures the patient group that they will be moving to 80% face to face consultations this week. Flu vaccinations will start from mid October. Booster Covid 19 injections for the over 50s and the vulnerable people will start in October and those affected will be notified by letter.
- Beat the Street started which sees a beat box outside both our primary schools and one at Queen St Mill. All primary schools have signed up to this and any club or individual can to. The aim, once you register is to walk run or cycle between as many boxes scattered around the town (there's a map provided) and click on each box you visit on each trip. You exercise and collect points at the same time. For the primary schools points can convert into new equipment and other things. There are prizes up for grabs for all involved! This will run for six weeks
- As usual we have dealt with rubbish related issues fly tipping, emptying and replacing dog waste bins, late collection of garden waste etc
- The demolition of the house on the corner of Standen Hall Drive is complete ready for work to begin on site. There are various restrictions in place on the developers about hours of work, delivery times and keeping the access roads clean and we ask residents to let us know of any problems.
- Although not in Briercliffe, permission to build on the land on Harrogate Cresent
 has been refused on the grounds of oversubscribed schools, oversubscribed
 surgeries and traffic. It means that the development is unsustainable.
- A memorial tree is to be planted at Towneley on 30th September by the Bishop of Burnley to remember all those who have died from Covid 19 in Burnley
- We had our first Artisan market in the town centre on the first Saturday in September and it will be back on the first Saturdays in October and November
- Next year will be the Queens 70th anniversary and we would like Briercliffe to mark it some way.
- Burnley Borough Council Parks officer, Kieron Roberts would like to attend the next meeting to show the plans for the refurbishment of Lane Bottom Park.
- Question for our County Councillor... Any prospect of anything being done to the Library which is becoming an eyesore?

Briercliffe Community Centre Report

- The Centre has reopened and most groups are returning slowly. Welcome back Parish Council!
- There are hand sanitisers available and the Centre is thoroughly cleaned and disinfected regularly.
- We are booking children's parties again which is a good source of income.
- We are still waiting for estimates to replace some of the brickwork. Various people have come to look at it but I haven't yet received a quote from any of them.
